



GUEST ACCESSIBILITY GUIDE

Welcome to Knott's Berry Farm!

We are glad you are here! At Knott's Berry Farm we are proud to have earned one of the best safety records in the industry. We are committed to providing our Guests with a safe environment and we want our Guests to have a safe and enjoyable day. We are continually striving to improve our facilities. If you have a suggestion for an improvement or have questions not answered in this brochure, please stop at Guest Services.

Many amusement park rides incorporate safety systems designed by the manufacturer to accommodate people of average physical stature and body proportion. These safety systems may place restrictions on the ability of an individual to safely experience the ride. Guests of larger or smaller size, Guests who have a history of heart, back or neck trouble, pregnant Guests, Guests who have had recent surgery, or Guests with casts, braces, restrictive devices or disabilities may not be safely accommodated by these systems. For example, height requirements are based on the size needed for the safety restraints to function properly and the level of maturity usually associated with a certain height.

Knott's Berry Farm's Ride Admission Policy has been developed in consultation with a safety and accessibility specialist, based on the recommendations of the manufacturer, our past experience and our evaluation of each ride using our knowledge of the ride in both normal and emergency operating conditions. Our prime consideration is the ability of each person to endure the dynamics of a ride without risk of injury to that person or other Riders.

If you feel that you or a member of your party may be affected by this policy, you are encouraged to visit Guest Services to obtain a list of rides you can safely ride. Your Rider Access Form will provide information for our Ride Operators to help accommodate you.

PLEASE RIDE SAFELY

While all amusement attractions have associated risks, certain individuals are at increased risk for injury from these attractions. Carefully evaluate each attraction to determine if you or members of your party can safely participate. We reserve the right to deny access to a ride to anyone who we feel may not be able to safely experience the ride or may be a hazard to other Riders.

A Rider Safety Guide sign is posted at every ride entrance and Alternate Access entrance. These signs provide height requirements, health restrictions, ride ratings, ride accessibility, and special instructions regarding the ride. Please review these signs prior to accessing the ride and ensure to follow all instructions provided.

In general, all Guests should be in good health and free from any conditions known or unknown that might be aggravated by riding. If you have any doubt about your ability to safely experience a ride, we urge you to consult with our staff at Guest Services. Remember, if you suspect your health could be at risk for any reason, or you could aggravate a pre-existing condition of any kind, **DO NOT RIDE.**

Generally, Guests must have the ability to brace themselves upright in the seat and support their head and neck during the ride movements. Guests using wheelchairs will have to transfer from their wheelchair to the ride unit by themselves or assisted by a member of their party in order to be able to ride. You should plan your visit with someone who can physically help you when necessary.

As a Guest, you are responsible for your own safety. Please read this guide and all instructional signage before riding. Listen to and follow all operator instructions. Any person who intentionally removes a safety restraint, violates a park safety policy, or appears to be under the influence of alcohol or chemical intoxicants will be removed from the park without refund. **FOR YOUR SAFETY, DO NOT ENTER AN UNAUTHORIZED AREA FOR ANY REASON.** You may be seriously injured if you enter an unauthorized area.

Before riding, please note all safety warnings for each ride. In general:

- Face forward and remain seated in an upright position with your back and shoulders against the seat back and hold on until the ride comes to a complete stop.
- All restraint systems, including lap bars, shoulder harnesses, and seatbelts, must be positioned, fastened, and tightened at all times.
- Due to the nature of our rides, backpacks, purses, electronics, stuffed animals, jewelry, and other loose items are not permitted on most rides. Glasses must be secured. Smaller items may be secured in cargo pockets or waist packs as long as they do not interfere with the restraint system. In addition, smaller items may be left in a locker or with a non-Rider. Knott's Berry Farm is not responsible for lost or stolen items. You are responsible for your personal property.
- Due to the nature of our rides, picture taking, cell phone usage, or electronic usage while riding is not permitted.
- Keep all parts of your body inside ride unit at all times.
- Shirt, shoes, and shorts/pants are required on most amusement park rides.
- Finish food and drink before boarding.
- Smoking, including e-cigarettes, is not permitted in Knott's Berry Farm.

RIDE RATING SYSTEM

A Ride Rating Program has been designed which provides a scale for rating the thrill factor of each ride. The intent is to provide a scale to guide park Guests in determining which attractions to ride based on their own experience level, physical condition, and abilities.

Each ride/attraction is placed into one of five categories:

CATEGORY		DESCRIPTION
Low Thrill Rides	1	Rides that are generally calm and gentle in nature.
Mild Thrill Rides	2	Rides that generally have low speeds with gentle motion and braking. Rides have smooth transitions with some changes in elevation and speed.
Moderate Thrill Rides	3	Rides that generally have low to medium speeds and/or heights with moderate motion and braking. Riders may encounter unexpected changes in direction and/or speed during portions of the ride.
High Thrill Rides	4	Rides that generally have medium to high speeds and/or heights with moderate to rapid braking. Riders may encounter unexpected changes in speed, direction and/or elevation.
Aggressive Thrill Rides	5	Rides that generally have one or more of the following: high speeds and/or heights, aggressive and unexpected forces, and rapid directional or elevation change. Riders will encounter many unexpected rapid changes in speed, direction, and/or elevation.

ACCESS SYMBOLS

Symbols indicate boarding procedures for each ride and are defined below.



This symbol is used to identify rides where Riders may remain in their wheelchair. Calico Railroad may accommodate one wheelchair at a time.



This symbol identifies rides that can accommodate Guests who are able to transfer from the wheelchair to the ride unit by themselves or assisted by a member of their party.



This symbol identifies rides where Guests must be able to walk independently or be assisted by a member of their party.

DEFINITIONS

Every ride entrance lists height requirements and special instructions regarding the ride. Knott's Berry Farm uses the following terms:



Ability to hold on or brace: Ability to use one's arms to maintain a grasp on an assist bar and support one's body during normal and emergency procedures on a ride and to use one's legs to brace to maintain a seated position during the forces of the ride.



Hand-held Infant: Hand-held infants are children who are unable to independently walk or maintain seated postural control and will only be able to ride the following rides with a Supervising Companion: Calico Mine Ride, Calico Railroad, Carrusel de California (chariot seating), Grand Sierra Railroad, Sky Cabin, and Stagecoach.



Supervising Companion: Many of our rides have height requirements to ride with a Supervising Companion. A Supervising Companion is a companion who is at least 54" in height and approximately 14 years of age, who meets all other criteria for riding, and who will assist their companion in complying with safe participation instructions. Supervising Companions are responsible for ensuring that the accompanied Rider remains seated properly where applicable and follows all rules and regulations. The Supervising Companion must be seated in the same seat (row) as the Rider who needs accompaniment, and can accompany the number of Riders for which the seat is designed. For example, if a seat is designed for three people, the Supervising Companion can accompany two Riders. An exception to this is at Balloon Race and Pig Pen's Mud Buggies where the accompanied Rider does not have to be in the same row.

HEALTH RESTRICTIONS



Each ride is evaluated against five primary health restrictions. These restrictions are:

- Back Trouble
- Heart Trouble/High Blood Pressure
- Neck Trouble
- Pregnancy
- Recent Surgery

If you are in doubt about your ability to safely experience a ride or would like more information, please review the information for each attraction in this Guest Accessibility Guide or review the Safety Guide and all warning signs posted at each ride entrance and Alternate Access Entrances.

PREGNANCY

Guests who are pregnant may ride Beagle Express Railroad, Calico Mine Ride, Calico Railroad, Carrusel de California, Sky Cabin, and Surfside Gliders.

HEIGHT REQUIREMENTS

Height requirements and specific instructions are posted at the entrance to each attraction. All Guests must meet all height and weight requirements for each attraction as posted at the attraction entrance. Guests may be measured at each attraction to ensure all requirements are being met prior to boarding an attraction.

For the safety of Guests, a shoe which does not contribute excessively to the Guest's height is required. For example, a Guest is not permitted to wear platform shoes to help meet a height requirement. Knott's Berry Farm reserves the right to ask that shoes be removed to ensure that a Guest's height is not being artificially enhanced or manipulated.

Attraction Accessibility Program

We are proud of our reputation for accommodating Guests with disabilities through our Attraction Accessibility Program. To provide equal access for all Guests, we have developed a program which allows Guests with mobility restrictions or cognitive impairment to access attractions. Information about where Guests access the ride is posted on each attraction's Safety Guide Sign. All Guests are required to meet all riding requirements for every attraction, including height and health restrictions in order to safely ride/participate.

Guests with a mobility restriction or cognitive impairment should visit Guest Services upon their arrival to express their inability to wait in the regular line. Some questions are asked to ensure that the Guest has the required physical criteria in order to safely experience attractions. Following that conversation, the Guest Services associate will provide the details needed to participate in the program.

Guests with mobility restrictions or cognitive impairments who request reasonable accommodations are encouraged to obtain the IBCCES Accessibility Card (IAC) by registering at accessibilitycard.org or via the Accessibility Card mobile app. Once a Guest has filled out the online application and uploaded necessary documentation into a secure online portal, they will be able to access their digital Accessibility Card. Guests will present the IBCCES Accessibility Card to Guest Services upon their arrival at the park to express their accommodation needs. Some questions are asked to ensure that the Guest has the required physical criteria in order to safely experience attractions. Following that conversation, the associate will provide the details needed to participate in the program.

Casts & Braces

Guests with casts and braces will be restricted from riding rides where the cast or brace will not fit inside the ride unit or where it will present a hazard to the Guest or others. Guests with full arm (elbow restricted) and full leg (knee restricted) casts or braces are restricted from most rides. We suggest you delay your visit until the cast is removed.

PROSTHETIC DEVICES

Guests with any type of prosthesis should not ride HangTime, La Revolucion, Los Voladores, Sol Spin, Supreme Scream, or Xcelerator unless they can ensure the device is properly secured and will remain in place during the ride. All Riders must be able to maintain the proper riding positioning. Guests should visit Guest Services prior to riding to ensure a safe riding experience.

Leg prosthetics are not permitted on Silver Bullet. Guests with any upper extremity prosthesis must ensure the device is properly secured or removed prior to riding Silver Bullet.

The manufacturer of Xcelerator requires that Riders with prosthetic devices must provide documentation from the manufacturer of their prosthetic device guaranteeing that the prosthetic device has been designed to remain in place on a high speed roller coaster ride exceeding a maximum of 120 MPH with maximum G forces from - 1 to 5 Gs with a sufficient safety factor for single point.

Note: Only IBCCES can Issue the IBCCES Accessibility Card, and not Knott's Berry Farm

RIDE DEVICES

Transfer devices, when requested, can be used to assist a Guest out of a wheelchair and into a ride unit. The following rides are equipped with a transfer device: Camp SNOOPY'S™ Off-Road Rally, Coast Rider, Sally's Swing Along, Sierra Sidewinder, and SNOOPY'S™ Tenderpaw Twister Coaster.

Body harnesses, when requested, allow certain Riders with disabilities the ability to ride if they meet the ride criteria. The following rides are equipped with a body harness: Silver Bullet.

In addition, specific ride vehicles are equipped with removable sides at Bear-y Tales. These vehicles may further assist Riders in transferring from their wheelchair to the ride unit. Please inform an associate at the ride if you wish to use that vehicle. Please see an associate at each ride or Guest Services for assistance.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION AND SERVICES

Our goal is to make Knott's Berry Farm as enjoyable and barrier-free as practical. Listed below are some of the services we offer. Please feel free to suggest areas in which we might improve in the future.



Braille & Large Print Guides

Print versions of the Park Guide and Guest Accessibility Guide are available at Guest Services. Braille and large print versions are also available. There are a limited number of print guides which are obtainable on a first-come, first-served basis.



First Aid

Our First Aid Building located next to Guest Services across from our GhostRider attraction is staffed from park open to park close. Medical equipment storage and refrigeration for Guests with medication is offered at First Aid.



Interpretive Services

If requested at least one week in advance, Knott's Berry Farm will provide American Sign Language Interpretation at live show venues. To arrange for sign language interpreting services, please submit a request via the internet at info@knotts.com. Live Show scripts or score sheets are available at each show venue upon request and must be returned at the end of the show.



Parking for Guests with Disabilities

Parking for Guests with disabilities is provided in the parking lot near the front gate on a first-come, first-served basis. Proper vehicle identification must be displayed. Security Officers on duty are authorized to ticket and/or tow vehicles that do not display proper identification.



Restrooms

Private restroom facilities for Guests needing the assistance of another Guest are available at in Fiesta Village across from La Revolucion, First Aid, across from the Stagecoach attraction, to the right of Wheeler Dealer Bumper Cars, in Camp Snoopy across from SNOOPY'S™ Tenderpaw Twister Coaster, and across from the Wilderness Dance Hall. Wheelchair-accessible stalls are located at all restrooms.



Rider Swap Program

The Rider Swap program allows one adult to stay with non-riders while the rest enjoy the ride. Upon their return, they can switch with the waiting adult, who can ride without joining the regular queue. For more information, visit Guest Services or any Ride Location.



Service Animals

Service animals are welcome at Knott's Berry Farm. A service animal is defined as a dog that has been individually trained to do work or perform tasks for a person with disabilities. Examples of such work or tasks include guiding people who are blind, alerting people who are deaf, pulling a wheelchair, alerting and protecting a person who is having a seizure, reminding a person with mental illness to take prescribed medications, calming a person with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) during an anxiety attack, or performing other duties. Service animals are working animals, not pets. The work or task a dog has been trained to provide must be directly related to the person's disability. Dogs whose sole function is to provide comfort or emotional support do not qualify as service animals.

Service animals must be housebroken, controlled with a restraining device, display appropriate behavior at all times while on our property. Guests whose service animal demonstrates aggressive and/or inappropriate actions toward a Guest or Associate will be directed to remove the animal from the park. There is a limit of one service animal per Guest.

Due to the nature of most rides, service animals must remain with a non-Riding member of your party. We are not permitted to take control of your service animal. Service animals may be taken on Beagle Express Railroad, Butterfield Stagecoach, Calico Mine Ride, Calico Railroad, Camp SNOOPY's Off-Road Rally, Carrusel de California, and Sky Cabin. Service animals must be leashed, under the owner's control, fit on the floor of the ride vehicle, and seated on the floor, not the ride seat. They may also attend the performances at Calico Mine Stage, Calico Park, and Wagon Camp. Service animals are not permitted in water attractions, wet decks, wading pools, or lazy rivers. They are permitted to walk through the park areas, including scare zones and mazes. Visit Guest Services for more information. Guests may take advantage of our Rider Swap policy for staying with the service animal. Visit Guest Services for more information.

Service Animal Relief Areas are located in Ghost Town — Left of Silver Bullet by the Stagecoach Trestle, Ghost Town/Boardwalk- Across from the Western Entrance, and Boardwalk between Wipeout and HangTime. Please look for the designated sign.



Special Dietary Needs

Although outside food and beverages are not allowed in the park, individuals who have special diets or need items due to a medical condition may bring small coolers to accommodate such needs. Please visit Guest Services for more information.



Wheelchair, Stroller and ECV Rental

A limited supply of wheelchairs, electric convenience vehicles (ECV), and strollers are available for rent at The Stroller Shop. Online reservations are available for wheelchair/ECV rentals in advance of your visit. Reservations can be made by going to **knotts.com** and visit the rentals page under the Tickets tab. Rentals are also available at the park while supplies last. For those Guests who choose to use a battery-powered vehicle or wheelchair, we require a safe speed be maintained while traveling in the park.

Wheelchairs, ECV's, and strollers may not be taken out of the park gates or to the parking lot. However, a park associate will be happy to provide any assistance you may need at that time. For any Guest using a personal Segway, please stop by Information prior to entering the park. Manual Wheelchairs are available at ride locations with Wheelchair Lifts if weight exceeds the max capacity of 750lb.

GUESTS USING WHEELCHAIRS OR ECV'S

Wheelchairs and ECV's cannot be accommodated on most rides and attractions, with the exception of Beagle Express Railroad and Calico Railroad, where one wheelchair can be accommodated. Please refer to the individual ride and attraction descriptions in the back of this brochure for more specific information.

On most rides where Guests in wheelchairs can be accommodated, Guests will need to leave their wheelchairs to be seated. In most cases, a wheelchair may be left in a designated position on or near the ride platform or walkway near the ride. Almost every ride is wheelchair accessible. A standard elevator is available at Bear-y Tales, GhostRider, and Silver Bullet to transport a Guest in a wheelchair to our 2nd story ride platform. Please use the call button at base of lift to request service. Calico Mine Ride, Dragon Swing, HangTime, and Sierra Sidewinder have a wheelchair lift available. Manual wheelchair available at all locations with a wheelchair lift if weight exceeds the max posted capacity. If an ECV has attachments to the vehicle which could impede with the operation of a lift or with safe lift ingress and egress, please transfer to manual wheelchair. Applicable attachments would include canopies, antennae, umbrellas, awnings, etc. Please ask an Associate at each location for assistance.

If in doubt about your ability to safely experience a ride, we urge you to consult with our staff at Guest Services. Knott's Berry Farm personnel are not trained in transferring Guests from wheelchairs to ride units and are not permitted to do so. You should plan your visit with someone who can physically help you when necessary.

Guests may re-charge their wheelchair battery at The Stroller Shop.

EVACUATIONS

Evacuations may be required due to mechanical reasons, weather conditions, or a power interruption. If an evacuation is required, Riders may need to maneuver across catwalks, from the highest point of the ride, and down steeply inclined catwalks or steps. Ride units may also stop at the top of a lift or on the ride course due to mechanical reasons. Certain evacuations may require Riders to use additional safety equipment during the process. Remain seated until given instructions. If an evacuation from a ride/attraction is required, for safety reasons, we may evacuate ambulatory Riders prior to evacuating those Riders using wheelchairs. If so, you accept any risk due to delayed evacuation if we need to physically lift or lower you.

GUESTS OF A LARGER SIZE

All restraint systems, including lap bars, shoulder harnesses, and seatbelts must be positioned and fastened properly to allow Guests to ride. Due to restraint system requirements, Guests of larger size (in terms of height, weight, and/or proportions) may not be accommodated on some of our rides.

Our larger Guests may experience difficulty on: Coast Rider, Dragon Swing, GhostRider, HangTime, Jaguar, La Revolucion, Los Voladores, Pony Express, Sierra Sidewinder, Silver Bullet, SNOOPY'S™ Tenderpaw Twister Coaster, Sol Spin, and Xcelerator.

Maximum and minimum weight limits can be found under the individual rides in this guide and on the Rider Safety Guide Signs at the entrance to rides with restrictions.

If you are concerned whether or not you can be accommodated safely on a ride, you may enter the ride via the exit to ensure the restraints function properly prior to waiting in line. The rest of your party may wait for you outside the exit.

Test seats are located at the ride entrances of: HangTime, Silver Bullet, and Xcelerator.

The manufacturer requires a maximum Guest height on the following rides: Flying Ace max height 54", HangTime max height 77", and Xcelerator max height 78".

LOOSE ARTICLES

Most rides cannot accommodate loose articles including jewelry, cell phones, hats, cameras, purses, backpacks, basketballs, umbrellas, beverage containers, electronic devices, etc. Items must be safely secured in cargo pockets, a waist pack, in a bin on the ride platform, in a locker, or with a non-Rider. Knott's Berry Farm is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged items. Any non-compliance which results in damage or injury to person or property will result in consequences up to and including prosecution.

Extra or bulky clothing, backpacks, and anything else that could potentially be between the Rider and the restraint will not be allowed. The restraint mechanism must be secured snugly against the Rider's body.

For safety reasons, cell phone usage, taking pictures, and filming on rides is prohibited.

Glasses must be secured on all rides. On La Revolucion, Sol Spin, Supreme Scream, Wipeout, and Xcelerator, glasses must be secured by an athletic strap or they cannot be worn on the ride.

Hearing devices and other electronic devices may be damaged by water at water rides and attractions. Please take necessary precautions to protect hearing devices on all rides.

LOST & FOUND

All items found at Knott's Berry Farm are turned in to the Information Center. If you lose an item on a ride, we will search for the article as soon as possible. In order to keep the ride in operation, an immediate search may not be possible. Lost articles may be reported via the internet at knotts.com/help/lost-and-found.

FOR YOUR SAFETY, DO NOT ENTER UNAUTHORIZED AREAS TO RETRIEVE LOST ARTICLES. You can be seriously injured if you enter an unauthorized area.

MAGNETIC FIELDS ON RIDES

Magnetics are used at the following attractions: Coast Rider, HangTime, Pony Express, Sierra Sidewinder, SNOOPY'S™ Tenderpaw Twister Coaster, and Xcelerator. Guests with medical devices sensitive to magnetic fields (pacemakers, hearing aids, etc.), should consider these factors when deciding to ride.

OXYGEN TANKS

Due to the dynamic nature of rides, Portable Oxygen Tanks are only permitted on the following rides: Calico Mine Ride, Calico Railroad, Carrusel de California (chariot), Beagle Express Off-Road Rally, and Sky Cabin. The tank must fit safely in the ride unit and not interfere with the ride restraint system.

Many rides can accommodate smaller Personal Oxygen Equipment. Personal Oxygen Equipment that can be secured around the waist, or with a strap that can be worn over the shoulder of one arm and under the other arm, may be permitted as long as the contents of the equipment housing can be contained. The equipment must allow the restraint mechanism to be secured snugly against the Rider's body. The equipment must not prevent Riders from properly sitting in the ride unit with their back and shoulders against the seat back. At no time may the equipment be between the Rider and the seat or the restraint. Riders must be free to hold on during the ride; therefore, nothing may be in their hands while riding.

STROBE LIGHTING AND SPECIAL EFFECTS

Many attractions utilize special effects including strobe lighting and specialty ride lights that may impact Guests with certain medical conditions. Rides utilizing these effects include: Bear-y Tales, Calico Mine Ride, GhostRider, HangTime, Jaguar, Pony Express, Silver Bullet, Sol Spin, Timber Mountain Log Ride, Xcelerator.

PROPER ATTIRE

Most rides require proper riding attire including shirts, shorts, and shoes. Proper attire must be worn in queues and all park pathways at all times. For your safety, loose clothing (including scarves and other free-flowing clothing) must be significantly secured or removed to prevent any interference with the ride restraint system. On all roller coasters, scarves will be required to be removed in their entirety.

Loose-fitting shoes may be removed before riding HangTime, La Revolucion, Los Voladores, Silver Bullet, Sol Spin, and Supreme Scream.

RIDER CRITERIA

Our Attraction Accessibility Program is designed to allow Guests to participate in the enjoyment of our attractions as much as possible. The program was developed by analyzing the physical and mental attributes required to safely ride each attraction. It is our policy to allow anyone to ride who meets all these requirements and is not a hazard to themselves or others. We continue to evaluate and update our Attraction Accessibility Program as necessary.

The evaluation of each attraction considered the following criteria:

Independent seated postural control.

The Guest must have the body and spinal control to sit upright without the aid of other people or devices. The Guest must also have sufficient muscle control to support their head, neck and upper torso during the course of the ride, including the dynamic motion of the ride. Certain ride units such as Carousel horses or Pony Express require the ability to form a saddle posture with the Guest's thighs.

Ability to exhibit independent seated postural control under the dynamic conditions of the ride.

The Rider must have the body and spinal control to sit upright without the aid of other people or devices. The Rider must also have sufficient muscle control to support their head, neck and upper torso during the course of the ride, including the dynamic motion of the ride. Certain ride units such as carousel horses require the ability to form a saddle posture with the Rider's thighs.

Appropriate center of gravity.

The Rider's body must have the appropriate weight distribution for that ride.

Ability to hold on with one functioning arm.

Riders must have one functioning arm that exhibits good grip control, the ability to brace, and is strong enough to allow the Rider to maintain proper riding position throughout the duration of the ride. A functioning arm may be a natural arm or a prosthesis which can be used for gripping and bracing. Any arm prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prosthetics.

Ability to hold on with two functioning arms.

Riders must have two functioning arms that exhibit good grip control, the ability to brace, and are strong enough to allow the Rider to maintain the proper riding position throughout the duration of the ride.

Ability to brace self with one functioning leg.

Riders must have one functioning leg to be used for bracing the body during the course of the ride. A functioning leg may be a natural leg or a prosthesis used for bracing the body during the course of participation and maintaining balance when entering and exiting a ride unit. Any leg prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prosthetics.

Ability to brace self with two functioning legs.

Riders must have two functioning legs to be used for bracing the body during the course of the ride and maintaining balance when entering and exiting a ride unit.

Minimum of two functioning extremities.

Riders must have a minimum of two functioning extremities (two legs, two arms, or one arm and one leg) to brace themselves during the ride and assist in entering and exiting the ride unit.

Minimum of three functioning extremities.

Riders must have a minimum of three functioning extremities (two legs and one arm or two arms and one leg) to brace themselves (with tripod bracing) during the ride and assist in entering and exiting the ride unit.

Minimum of four functioning extremities.

Riders must have a four functioning extremities (two legs and two arms) to brace themselves during the ride and assist in entering and exiting the ride unit.

Ability to enter/exit ride within specified parameters without endangering self or others.

Riders must be able to enter and exit the ride without jeopardizing themselves or others and to assist with their own evacuation, if necessary. This may include special arrangements such as entering through the Alternate Access Entrance or having someone aid in boarding. For the safety of our Associates and Guests, Associates are instructed not to perform any lifting of Guests.

Appropriate observed behavior:

Rider demonstrates appropriate observed behavior indicating a willingness and ability to participate and/or follow Rider requirements. Appropriate observed behavior may include, but not be limited to maintaining proper riding position, attention and compliance to safety instructions, proper use of all ride safety equipment and willingness to participate.

Guests have a duty to:

- Exercise good judgement
- Act in a responsible manner while using amusement rides
- Obey all warnings prior to and during participation
- Not participate while under the influence of alcohol or drugs
- Properly use all ride safety equipment provided

RIDES

The following descriptions are designed to give you information on the type of actions caused by various rides. Each of the following attractions will identify the restrictions according to the criteria itemized above. In order to participate on most attractions, Guests must have seated postural control, appropriate center of gravity, appropriate observed behavior, and the ability to enter and exit the ride safely.

Specific exceptions or qualifications to those four criteria will be noted in the information provided below. If you have been authorized for Alternate Access, follow the directions listed under each ride.

Balloon Race 2



Guests must be 36" tall to ride alone or accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held Infants are not permitted.

This ride only accommodates one adult per balloon.

A hot air balloon ride that spins and raises Riders in the air.

Restraint System: A shared seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the Guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or broken collar bone are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the ride unit may shift. Do not use the ride restraints for support as they will shift.

Beagle Express Railroad 2



Guests must be 46" tall to ride alone OR accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests less than 46" tall must sit in the center of the bench.

Maximum Weight – 570 lb. per bench; this ride only accommodates three adults per bench.

Riders board an antique train ride that offers a round trip around Silver Bullet Lake.

Restraint System: A safety chain encapsulates the ride unit to secure guests.

Rider Criteria: Guests who do not have independent seated postural control, appropriate observed behavior, and hand-held infants must ride with a Supervising Companion.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the attraction exit. This attraction is wheelchair accessible. Service animals must be leashed, under the owner's control, fit on the floor of the ride vehicle, and seated on the floor, not the ride seat.

Bear-y Tales: Return to the Fair 2



Guests must be 46" tall to ride alone OR accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held Infants not permitted.

A family themed interactive dark ride.

Restraint System: An enclosed ride unit encapsulates the ride unit to secure the Riders.

Rider Criteria: Riders must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests who do not have independent seated postural control, an appropriate center of gravity, ability to enter/exit safely, or appropriate observed behavior must ride with a Supervising Companion.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Specific ride vehicles at this attraction are equipped with removable sides which may assist a Rider in transferring from their wheelchair to the ride unit. Please inform an associate if you wish to use that vehicle.

WARNING This ride contains strobe lighting.

Butterfield Stagecoach 1



Guests must be 46" tall to ride alone OR accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests less than 46" tall must sit in the center of the bench.

You can take a ride on one of six stagecoaches, five of which are authentic, and used in the 1800s. The trail travels around Fiesta Village and Camp SNOOPY™.

Restraint System: A shared seatbelt secures each rider across the thighs and pelvis on the upper level. A door encloses the ride unit on the lower level.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the Guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up into the unit. Service Animals are permitted to ride this attraction. Service animals must be leashed, under the owners control, fit on the floor of the ride vehicle and seated on the floor, not the ride seat.

Calico Mine Ride ▲ 3



Guests must be 46" tall to ride alone OR accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests less than 46" tall must sit in the center of the bench.

Riders board an antique train ride that offers a view of the mining process as it was done in the early 1900s.

Restraint System: A door encapsulates the mine car to secure Riders.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities. Guests who do not have independent seated postural control, appropriate observed behavior, and Hand-held Infants must ride in the center of the bench with a Supervising Companion.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Service animals must be leashed, under the owners control, fit on the floor of the ride vehicle and seated on the floor, not the ride seat.

Calico Railroad ● 1



Guests must be 46" tall to ride alone OR accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests less than 46" tall must sit in the center of the bench.

Riders board an antique train ride that offers a round trip through the park.

Rider Criteria: Guests who do not have independent seated postural control, appropriate observed behavior, and hand-held Infants must ride in the center of the bench with a Supervising Companion.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. This attraction is wheelchair accessible. Service animals must be leashed, under the owners control, fit on the floor of the ride vehicle and seated on the floor, not the ride seat.

Calico River Rapids ◆ 4



Guests must be 46" tall to ride.

A family water ride where Riders travel in rafts along a man-made river full of rapids, geysers, canyons, and waterfalls. Rafts float and bounce down high-speed rapids, often rotating rapidly after impacting with the bank of the river. Riders will get wet.

Restraint System: An individual seatbelt secures each Rider across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps along a moving turntable, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping down into the ride unit. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting. Watch your step, as the ride unit may be slippery and wet.

Note: Loose articles, including footwear, may not be left on the platform. All loose articles must be brought onboard the raft with Riders. These items will get wet. Please consider leaving loose articles with a non-Rider.

CAUTION: Boats may bump into the side of channel and other boats.

Camp SNOOPY'S™ Off-Road Rally ■ 2



Guests must be 36" tall to ride alone OR accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

Maximum Weight – 440 lb. per truck; this ride only accommodates two adults per truck. The adult must sit in the back seat.

A jeep-styled car ride that slowly travels through a scenic journey on a designated track.

Restraint System: An individual seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. A transfer device is available upon request which may assist a Guest out of a wheelchair and into the ride unit. Service animals must be leashed, under the owner's control, fit on the floor of the ride vehicle, and seated on the floor, not the ride seat.

Charlie Brown's Kite Flyer 2



Guests must be 36" tall to ride alone OR accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held Infants are not permitted.

Maximum Weight – 275 lb. per swing; this ride only accommodates one adult per swing.

Chair swing children's ride with free-hanging seats suspended from an elevated, rotating, and slanting tower. Riders will rotate in a circular motion as the tower begins to rise.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar is positioned above the laps of all Riders in the row with an individual between-the-legs safety belt. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the Guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into a suspended seat. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

Carrusel de California 1



Guests must be 46" tall to ride alone OR accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held Infants must ride in a chariot.

A ride which features various circus animals – both stationary and moving up and down – and chariot seating mounted on a circular platform that rotates.

Restraint System: An individual seatbelt secures each Rider around the waist on each animal. Guests under 46" must be seated in a chariot or ride on the middle row of animals and be held by a Supervising Companion who is standing on the platform between the animals. Only one Rider per animal.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have the ability to straddle the ride unit. Guests unable to straddle the ride unit or do not have the ability to hold on with one functioning arm must be seated in a chariot unit. Guests who do not have independent seated postural control, an appropriate center of gravity, or appropriate observed behavior must ride in a chariot with a Supervising Companion. Guests with a full leg cast must be seated in a chariot.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up onto a platform. Service animals must be leashed, under the owners control, fit on the floor of the ride vehicle and seated on the floor, not the ride seat.

Coast Rider 4



Guests must be 54" tall to ride alone or 44" and accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

A steel roller coaster with airtime hills and hairpin turns. Riders will experience changes in speed and direction, moments of weightlessness, and rapid movements from side-to-side.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar secures each Rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. A transfer device is available upon request which may assist a Rider out of a wheelchair and into the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

Dragon Swing 3



Guests must be 48" tall to ride alone OR accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held Infants are not permitted.

Maximum Weight – 680 lb. per row

A swinging boat ride that produces a feeling of weightlessness.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. Smaller Riders must sit towards the middle of the row.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the Guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride. Full leg cast must fit safely in the ride unit in order to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up into the ride unit. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

Flying Ace 2



Guests must be between 32" and 54" tall to ride

A slow-moving plane ride that goes up and down as the ride rotates around in a circle. Riders can use a joystick to control the elevation of their unit.

Restraint System: An individual seatbelt secures each Rider across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar or neck brace are not permitted to ride

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit.

GhostRider 5



Guests must be 48" tall to ride.

A high-speed wooden roller coaster with high-speed airtime humps, quick turns, and enclosed tunnels.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and seatbelt secures each Rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests must have a minimum of one full functioning leg (excluding prosthesis) and one leg amputated below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

WARNING: This ride contains strobe lighting.

HangTime 5



Guests must be between 48" tall and 77" tall to ride.

A high-speed dive roller coaster, which turns Riders upside down multiple times. Riders will experience weightlessness and rapid movements from side-to-side.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and seatbelt secures each Rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size. A test seat is located at the ride entrance which can be used to ensure proper fit and comfort prior to waiting in line.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests must have sufficient lower extremities to ensure the ride restraint system adequately restrains them. Both legs must include the knee. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or broken collar bone are not permitted to ride. Casts are not permitted on this ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. A wheelchair lift is available to transport Guests from the exit to the ride platform.

Hat Dance 3



Guests must be 42" tall to ride alone OR 36" and accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Maximum Weight – 550 lb. per unit

Maximum Riders per unit – 4

Maximum Adults per unit – 2

A circular spinning ride where Guests can control the speed of the spin by turning the wheel in the center of the hat.

Restraint System: A locked door encloses the ride unit.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

Jaguar! 

Guests must be 48" tall to ride.

A steel coaster with mild drops, bumps, and turns.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and shared seatbelt secures each Rider across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the Guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping down into the ride unit.

La Revolucion



Guests must be 48" tall to ride.

Maximum Weight – 680 lb. per gondola.

A thrill ride that swings to the height of 65 feet in a pendulum motion while spinning in a clockwise rotation. Riders will experience changes in direction and elevation as well as moments of weightlessness while aboard the ride.

Restraint System: A shoulder harness with a between-the-legs safety belt secures each Guest over the head and across the chest. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the Guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Guests with any type of prosthesis should not ride unless they can ensure the device is properly secured and will remain in place during the ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into a suspended seat. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the ride unit may shift. Do not use the ride restraints for support as they will shift.

Linus™ Launcher 3



Guests must be 42" tall to ride OR 36" tall and accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Maximum Weight— 275 lb. per unit; this ride only accommodates one adult per vehicle.

A circular ride where Riders experience the sensation of flying in an elevated, slanted, and prone position. Riders will rotate in a circular motion as the tower begins to rise.

Restraint System: A cage secures Riders across the back, shoulders and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities; two functioning arms and one functioning leg. Guests must have sufficient lower extremities to ensure the ride restraint system adequately restrains them. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the ride unit may shift. Do not use the ride restraints for support as they will shift.

Los Voladores 3



Guests must be 48" tall to ride. Guests must be at least 6 years old.

Maximum Weight – 230 lb. per seat

A chair swing family ride with free-hanging seats suspended from an elevated, rotating, and slanting tower. Riders will rotate in a circular motion as the tower begins to rise.

Restraint System: An individual bar and a between-the-legs safety belt secures each Rider.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the Guest has a normal center of gravity and the lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Guests with any type of prosthesis should not ride unless they can ensure the device is properly secured and will remain in place during the ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the attraction exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the ride unit may shift. Do not use the ride restraints for support as they will shift.

Pacific Scrambler 3



Guests must be 48" tall to ride alone or 36" and accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Maximum Weight – 510 lb. per car

Rotating cars are mounted on counter-rotating arms, which produces strong accelerations and side-to-side movement, changing force and direction rapidly.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar and seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. The smaller Rider must sit on the inside seat.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the Guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests may have two functioning legs instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the ride unit may shift. Do not use the ride restraints for support as they will shift.

Pigpen's Mud Buggies 2



Guests must be 36" tall to ride alone or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held Infants are not permitted.

Maximum Weight – 382 lb. per car; this ride only accommodates one adult per car.

Vehicles that jump up and down while rotating around a circular track.

Restraint System: An individual seatbelt secures each Rider across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities: one functioning arm (excluding prosthesis) and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

Pony Express 4



Guests must be 48" tall to ride.

A roller coaster where Riders sit astride a horse while being launched out of the station reaching up to 38 miles per hour in 3 seconds. Riders will experience changes in speed and direction and rapid movements from side-to-side.

Restraint System: An individual back bar and leg bars will secure each Rider on their back and along their legs. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have two functioning arms and two functioning legs. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or broken collar bone are not permitted to ride. Casts are not permitted on this ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into an elevated seat.

WARNING: This ride contains strobe lighting.

Rapid River Run 2



Guests must be 42" tall to ride alone OR accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held Infants are not permitted. This ride only accommodates one adult per row.

This spinning tugboat ride which travels back and forth over an upward, curved track.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. A door further encloses the ride unit.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up into the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

Sally's Swing Along 2



Guest must be between 42" tall and 73" tall to Ride or 36" tall and accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Maximum Weight— 1,980 lb. per ride; this ride accommodates four adults. Adults must sit on the outside seats.

A large swing ride designed for children that produces a feeling of weightlessness.

Restraint System: A shared safety bar is positioned above the laps of all riders in the row. A between-the-legs safety belt secures each rider.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift. A transfer device is available upon request which may assist a Guest out of a wheelchair and into the ride unit.

Sierra Sidewinder 4



Guests must be 48" tall to ride alone or 42" tall accompanied by a Supervising Companion. The manufacturer of this ride requires the Supervising Companion to be at least 54" tall.

Four-seat roller coaster cars that traverse a steel track while rotating freely 360 degrees.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and seatbelt secures each Rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. A transfer device is available upon request which may assist a Rider out of a wheelchair and into the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

WARNING: This ride utilizes magnetic systems during the ride.

Silver Bullet 5



Guests must be 54" tall to ride.

A high-speed, inverted looping roller coaster which turns Riders upside down multiple times. Riders will experience changes in speed and direction, weightlessness, and rapid movements from side-to-side.

Restraint System: A shoulder harness with a between-the-legs safety belt secures each Rider over the head and across the chest. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size. A test seat is located at the ride entrance, which can be used to evaluate proper fit and comfort prior to waiting in line.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. One functioning arm that includes a hand is required to ride. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the Guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be below the knee. Casts are not permitted on this ride. Guests who do not have appropriate center of gravity must have sufficient lower extremities to ensure the ride restraint system adequately restrains them. Alternatively, Guests with certain amputations may be able to ride with the use of a separate full body harness provided the Guest has remaining leg and arm remnants to be secured by the harness. Guests should check with Guest Services to determine if they are eligible to ride using the full body harness. Guests with any upper extremity prosthesis must ensure the device is properly secured or removed prior to riding. Leg prosthetics are not permitted.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into a suspended seat. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift. A wheelchair lift is available to transport Guests from the exit to the ride platform. Limit one Rider in wheelchair and one companion in lift at a time.

WARNING: This ride contains strobe lighting.

Sky Cabin 2



Guests must be 46" tall to ride alone or accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests less than 46" tall must sit in the center of the bench.

An air-conditioned, enclosed cabin which rotates while at the top, 180 feet in the air.

Rider Criteria: Guest who do not have seated postural control or do not demonstrate appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by Supervising Companion

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Service animals must be leashed, under the owners control, fit on the floor of the ride vehicle and seated on the floor, not the ride seat.

SNOOPY'S™ Tenderpaw Twister Coaster 3



Guests must be 42" tall to ride alone OR 36" tall and accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Maximum Weight – 300 lb. per seat; this ride only accommodates one adult per row.

A steel rollercoaster with mild drops, bumps, and turns.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar secures each Rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Riders of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning extremities are sufficient, instead of three functioning extremities if the Guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. One extremity must be a leg and Guest must be accompanied by a supervising companion.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift. A transfer device is available upon request which may assist a Guest out of a wheelchair and into the ride unit.

WARNING: This ride utilizes magnetic systems during the ride.

Sol Spin 

Guests must be 54" tall to ride.

An inverting thrill ride where units rotate on a 360-degree axis while spinning to a maximum height of 64 feet around the center hub. Riders will experience weightlessness, strong side-to-side movement, and rapidly changing forces and directions.

Restraint System: A shoulder harness with a between-the-legs safety belt secures each Rider over the head and across the chest. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the Guest is able to form a saddle posture with leg remnants sufficient to brace self upright in seat against the shoulder harness. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Guests with any type of prosthesis should not ride unless they can ensure the device is properly secured and will remain in place during the ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the ride unit may shift. Do not use the ride restraints for support as they will shift.

WARNING: This ride contains strobe lighting.

Supreme Scream 5



Guests must be 52" tall to ride.

A tower ride with a chair lift-type seat where Riders are propelled up or shot down at high speeds. Guests will experience the feeling of weightlessness and elevation change as they ascend and descend each ride tower.

Restraint System: A shoulder harness with a between-the-legs safety belt secures each Rider over the head and across the chest. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have at least one functioning arm and sufficient lower extremities to ensure the ride restraint system adequately restrains them. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Guests with any type of prosthesis should not ride unless they can ensure the device is properly secured and will remain in place during the ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into a suspended seat. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

NOTE: Glasses may only be worn on this attraction if they are secured with an athletic strap. Glasses may not be held in the hands while riding.

Surfside Gliders



Guests must be 44" tall to ride alone OR 36" and accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Maximum Weight – 340 lb.per car

Riders ride in suspended cars that rotate in a circle. Once the ride's speed increases, Riders use a fin on the front of the car to steer the car higher or lower.

Restraint System: A shared seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. The smaller Rider must sit on the inside seat.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests must have a minimum of one full functioning leg (including prosthesis) and one leg amputated below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar or neck brace are not permitted to ride. Guests who do not demonstrate appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a supervising companion.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

Timber Mountain Log Ride



Guests must be 46" tall to ride alone OR 36" tall accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

This is a water flume ride; Riders may get wet. Guests will be seated in a rocking boat and brace for a plunge down a chute and a splash of water.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the Guest is able to form a saddle posture with leg remnants sufficient to brace self upright in the seat. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping down into the ride unit. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting. Watch your step, as the ride unit may be slippery and wet.

WARNING: Logs may bump into the side of channel and other logs.

WARNING: This ride contains strobe lighting.

Wheeler Dealer Bumper Cars 4



Guests must be 48" tall to ride alone OR 42" and accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

A bumper car ride where Guests drive cars one way around a circular track. Riders will experience strong side-to-side movement and rapidly changing direction and forces.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. An individual shoulder strap is positioned across the chest and under the arm of each Rider under 48".

Rider Criteria: Guests who do not demonstrate appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Driver Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities.

Passenger Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests with a visual impairment or who are not able to steer and press the accelerator must ride as a passenger with a driver who meets the requirements to drive.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

WARNING: Avoid head-on collisions.

Wipeout 4



Guests must be 48" tall to ride.

Maximum Weight – 384 lb. per row

A circular ride that rises to a tilted position while rotating creating a wave motion.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar and seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the Guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat.

Woodstock's Airmail 2



Guests must be 36" tall to ride.

Maximum Weight – 300 lb. per seat; this ride only accommodates two adults per ride.

This children's ride hoists Riders up in the air and provides a gentle yet bouncy trip down.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar is positioned above the laps of all Riders in the row. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities; one functioning arm that includes a hand and two functioning legs. Guests may ride with one leg amputation; amputation must be at the knee or below. Guests with the leg amputation must be at least 42" tall to ride or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Lower body casts (foot, lower leg, etc.) are not permitted on this ride. Guests with any prosthesis must consult with Guest Services prior to waiting in line or riding.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat.

Xcelerator



Guests must be between 52" and 78" tall to ride.

A high-speed strata coaster. Riders will experience weightlessness, strong positive forces, and rapid movements from side-to-side.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and seatbelt secures each Rider across the thighs and pelvis. The lap bar must be in firm contact with the pelvis and muscular parts of the thighs. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size. A test seat is located at the ride entrance which can be used to ensure proper fit and comfort prior to waiting in line.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests may ride with one leg amputation; amputation must be below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Guests with any prosthesis must consult with Guest Services prior to waiting in line or riding.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

Note: Loose articles may not be left on the platform. They may either be left with a non-Rider or be placed in lockers for storage. Glasses may only be worn on this attraction if they are secured with an athletic strap. Glasses may not be held in the hands of Riders while riding.
