



GUEST ACCESSIBILITY GUIDE

WELCOME TO CEDAR POINT SHORES!

We are glad you are here! At Cedar Point Shores, we are proud to have earned one of the best safety records in the industry. We are committed to providing our Guests with a safe environment so they may enjoy their day. We are continually striving to improve our facilities.

Many amusement park attractions incorporate safety systems designed by the manufacturer to accommodate people of average physical stature and body proportion. These safety systems may place restrictions on the ability of an individual to safely experience the attraction. Guests of larger or smaller size, Guests who have a history of heart, back, or neck trouble, Guests who are pregnant, Guests who have had recent surgery, or Guests with casts, braces, restrictive devices, or disabilities may not be safely accommodated by these systems. For example, height requirements are based on the size needed for the safety restraints to function properly and the level of maturity usually associated with a certain height.

The Attraction Accessibility Program has been developed using our past experiences and our evaluation of each attraction in both normal and emergency operating conditions. We also work closely with the manufacturer of each attraction and our policies incorporate the manufacturers' guidelines as well as the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act. We hope that this Guide will help Guests make the best choices to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience at the park. Our goal is to safely and efficiently accommodate the needs of all Guests, including individuals with disabilities.

Our prime consideration is the ability of each person to endure the dynamics of a attraction without risk of injury to that person or other participants. If you have a suggestion for an improvement or have questions not answered in this brochure, please stop at the Information Station. If you feel that you or a member of your party may be affected by this policy, you are encouraged to visit the Information Station to obtain a list of attractions you can safely enjoy. Your Rider Access Form will provide information for our Associates to help accommodate you.

PLEASE PARTICIPATE SAFELY

Under the **Ohio Revised Code Section 993.08**, Riders must obey all warnings and directions regarding amusement park rides and behave in a manner that will not cause or contribute to injury to themselves or others. Failure to comply is a misdemeanor.

While all amusement attractions have associated risks, certain individuals are at increased risk for injury from these attractions. Carefully evaluate each attraction to determine if you or members of your party can safely participate. We reserve the right to deny access to an attraction to anyone who we feel may not be able to safely experience the attraction or may be a hazard to other participants.

A Safety Guide sign is posted at every attraction entrance and Alternate Access entrance. These signs provide height requirements, health restrictions, ride ratings, ride accessibility, and special instructions regarding the attraction. Please review these signs prior to accessing the attraction and ensure to follow all instructions provided.

In general, all Guests should be in good health and free from any conditions, known or unknown, that might be aggravated by riding. If you have any doubt about your ability to safely experience an attraction, we urge you to consult with our staff at the Information Station. Remember, if you suspect your health could be at risk for any reason, or you could aggravate a pre-existing condition of any kind, **do not participate!**

Generally, Guests must have the ability to brace themselves upright in the seat and support their head and neck during the attraction movements. Guests using wheelchairs will have to transfer from their wheelchair to the ride unit by themselves or assisted by a member of their party in order to be able to ride. You should plan your visit with someone who can physically help you when necessary.

As a Guest, you are responsible for your own safety. Please read this guide and all instructional signage before riding. Listen to and follow all operator instructions. Any person who intentionally removes a safety restraint, violates a park safety policy, or appears to be under the influence of alcohol or chemical intoxicants will be removed from the park without refund. **For your safety, do not enter an unauthorized area for any reason.** You may be seriously injured if you enter an unauthorized area.

Before riding, please note all safety warnings for each attraction. In general:

- Follow all proper Rider positioning and hold on until the ride comes to a complete stop.
- Due to the nature of our rides, backpacks, purses, electronics, stuffed animals, jewelry, and other loose items are not permitted on most attractions. Cedar Point Shores is not responsible for lost or stolen items. You are responsible for your personal property.
- No picture taking, cell phone or electronic usage while participating.
- Finish food and drink before boarding.
- Smoking, including e-cigarettes, is not permitted in Cedar Point Shores.

CEDAR POINT RIDE RATING SYSTEM

A Ride Rating System has been designed which provides a scale for rating the thrill factor of each attraction. The intent is to provide a scale to guide park Guests in determining which attractions to ride based on their own experience level, physical condition, and abilities.

Each attraction is placed into one of five categories:

CATEGORY		DESCRIPTION
Low Thrill Rides	1	This is a low-speed and/or shallow water attraction.
Mild Thrill Rides	2	This is a low to medium speed attraction and/or water depth to 48 inches. Some Rider control, maneuvering, and/or swimming skills required.
Moderate Thrill Rides	3	This is a medium-speed attraction. Height and water depth may vary. Moderate or unexpected forces can be generated during the ride. This attraction may require Rider control and/or strong swimming skills. Physical activity may be strenuous.
High Thrill Rides	4	This is a fast-paced ride experience. Riders will encounter changes in speed, direction, elevation, strong water currents, and/or depth of water, some of which is unexpected. This attraction requires Rider body control and strong swimming skills.
Aggressive Thrill Rides	5	This is a high-speed and/or deep water attraction with turbulent turns, drops and/or strong water currents with changes in speed, direction, elevation, and/or deep water, which may be unexpected. This attraction requires Rider body control and swimming skills.

ACCESS SYMBOLS

Symbols indicate boarding procedures for each ride and are defined below.

-  This symbol is used to identify attraction where Guest may remain in their wheelchair.
-  This symbol identifies attractions that can accommodate Guests who are able to transfer from the wheelchair to the attraction unit by themselves or assisted by a member of their party.



This symbol identifies where Guests must be able to walk independently or be assisted by a member of their party.

DEFINITIONS

Every attraction entrance lists height requirements and special instructions regarding the attraction. Cedar Point Shores uses the following terms:



Ability to hold on or brace: Ability to use one's arms to maintain a grasp on an assist bar and support one's body during normal and emergency procedures on an attraction and to use one's legs to brace to maintain a seated position during the forces of the ride.



Hand-held Infant: Hand-held infants are children who are unable to independently walk or maintain seated postural control and will only be able to ride the following rides with a Supervising Companion: Breakwater Bay (water depth may be restricted), Cedar Creek, Great Lakes Cove, Lakeslide Landing (Pool only), Lemmy's Lagoon, Runaway Rapids, and Waterin' Hole. Hand-held infants and their Supervising Companion may also enjoy SplashH2O, but may not participate on the elevated sections of the attractions.



Supervising Companion: Many of our attractions have height requirements that allow a Guest under that requirement to ride with a Supervising Companion. A Supervising Companion is a companion who is at least 54" in height and approximately 14 years of age, who meets all other criteria for riding, and who will assist their companion in complying with safe participation instructions. Supervising Companions are responsible for ensuring that the accompanied participant remains seated properly where applicable and follows all rules and regulations. The Supervising Companion must be seated next to the participant who needs accompaniment and can accompany one participant. The exceptions to this are Breakwater Bay, Cedar Creek, Great lakes Cove, Lily Pad Walk, and Runaway Rapids; where a Supervising Companion may accompany two participants.

HEALTH RESTRICTIONS



Each ride is evaluated against five primary health restrictions. These restrictions are:

- Back Trouble
- Heart Trouble/High Blood Pressure
- Neck Trouble
- Pregnancy
- Recent Surgery

If you are in doubt about your ability to safely experience an attraction or would like more information, please review the information for each attraction in this Guest Accessibility Guide or review the Safety Guide and all warning signs posted at each attraction entrance and Alternate Access Entrances.

PREGNANCY

Guests who know or believe they may be pregnant should follow all rules, guidelines, and restrictions listed for each attraction. Those who are pregnant should not ride an attraction that specifically lists pregnancy as a participation restriction. Please closely review all rules and guidelines at the entrance of each attraction.

Guests who are pregnant may participate in Cedar Creek, Breakwater Bay, Great Lakes Cove, Lemmy's Lagoon, and Waterin' Hole.

HEIGHT REQUIREMENTS

Height requirements and specific instructions are posted at the entrance to each attraction. Height measurements are taken in bare feet.

Guests may be "officially" measured at the Information Station. The measured Guest will be given a wristband to indicate their height range. Wristbands are not required to participate. They are intended to make your wait in line shorter by streamlining the Guest height measurement process.

To accurately measure Guests, a height measuring device may be used during the height measuring process. This device may come into contact with the Guest's head for a brief period.

LIFE JACKETS

Life jackets are available for all Guests. Only US Coast Guard approved life jackets are allowed as floatation devices. Life jackets are provided free of charge for Guests who require one.

In wave pools, life jackets are required for Guests who are less than 52" tall in bare feet, participants with a history of seizures (or similar medical conditions), heart conditions, or those who are inexperienced or non-swimmers. Children who are less than 42" tall must wear life jackets and be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. This policy will be enforced at Breakwater Bay.

In other attractions requiring life jackets, children who are less than 48" tall in bare feet or those who are inexperienced or non-swimmers must wear a life jacket. Children who are less than 42" tall must wear life jackets

and be accompanied by a Supervising Companion.
 This policy will be enforced at Cedar Creek and
 Runaway Rapids.

CASTS & BRACES

Guests with casts and braces will be restricted from participating on/in attractions where the cast or brace will not fit inside the attraction unit, or present a hazard to the Guests or others. Guests with full arm (elbow restricted) and full leg (knee restricted) casts or braces are restricted from most attractions and water slides. We suggest you delay your visit until the cast is removed. Casts and braces with exposed metal parts are not permitted on most slides in Cedar Point Shores.

PROSTHESIS

Guests with which do not have any exposed metal parts are generally permitted on all waterpark attractions. Please consult with a member of the Aquatics Supervisory Team prior to riding to ensure that you have a safe riding experience.

ONGOING LIFEGUARD TRAINING

In an ongoing effort to provide a safe and enjoyable waterpark experience for our Guests, Cedar Point Shores routinely utilizes training exercises to improve our lifeguards' skills and vigilance. These exercises will occur during normal operating hours and may consist of the following: submersible water manikins, the use of video surveillance equipment, internal and external audits, and responsive/unresponsive water rescues and/or first aid scenarios.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION & SERVICES

Our goal is to make Cedar Point Shores as enjoyable and barrier-free as practical. Listed below are some of the services we offer. Please feel free to suggest areas in which we might improve in the future.



Braille & Print Guest Accessibility Guides

Print versions of the Park Guide and Guest Accessibility Guide are available at the Information Station. Braille and large print versions are also available. There are a limited number of print guides which are obtainable on a first-come, first-served basis.



Campground & Hotel Shuttle Buses

A courtesy shuttle is available for transportation from the campground to and from park entrances, hotels, and Cedar Point restaurants. Available to Resort Guests only. Phones to call a Courtesy Shuttle are located at each stop.

Courtesy Shuttle locations:

- **Hotel Breakers:** Front Entrance
- **Lighthouse Point:** Bench adjacent to the Registration Office, Bench near the park. Pool, restrooms located near east end.
- **Marina:** Right of the Marina Building
- **Bay Harbor:** Request a shuttle at the hostess stand
- **Cedar Point Shores:** Right of the main entrance
- **Main Gate:** At front of Season Pass Center



Family Services

A space for nursing mothers is available at Cedar Point Shores First Aid. Baby changing areas and

a companion restroom can be found in most restrooms. Please feel free to ask an Associate for directions to these locations or review a park map.



First Aid

Our First Aid Building, located on the East side of the park, near Crosscurrent and Plunge Slide, is staffed from park open to park close. Medical equipment storage and refrigeration for Guests with medication is offered at First Aid.



Parking for Guests with Disabilities

Accessible parking is available on a first-come, first-served basis within the main parking lots of the park. When you arrive at the parking toll booths, ask an Associate for instructions regarding where to proceed to the accessible parking lot. Both auto and van accessible spaces are provided. A valid disabled persons parking placard or license plate must be displayed at all times while parked in the designated accessible parking area. If the designated accessible parking area is full at the time of your arrival, members of your party may be dropped off at the main pick-up/drop-off area, near the main entrance to the park. Proper vehicle identification must be displayed. Security Officers on duty are authorized to ticket and/or tow vehicles that do not display proper identification. Please ask an Associate for directions to additional parking areas.



Restrooms

Private restroom facilities for Guests needing the assistance of a companion are available at the Front Gate Family Restrooms and at Breakwater Bay. Wheelchair accessible stalls are located at all restrooms.



Service Animals

Service animals are welcome at Cedar Point Shores. A service animal is defined as a dog that has been individually trained to do work or perform tasks for a person with disabilities. Examples of such work or tasks include guiding people who are blind, alerting people who are deaf, pulling a wheelchair, alerting and protecting a person who is having a seizure, reminding a person with mental illness to take prescribed medications, calming a person with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) during an anxiety attack, or performing other duties. Service animals are working animals, not pets. The work or task a dog has been trained to provide must be directly related to the person's disability. Dogs whose sole function is to provide comfort or emotional support do not qualify as service animals.

Service animals must be housebroken, controlled with a restraining device, display appropriate behavior at all times while on our property. Guests whose service animal demonstrates aggressive and/or inappropriate actions

toward a Guest or an associate will be directed to remove the animal from the park. There is a limit of one service animal per Guest.

We are not permitted to take control of your service animal. Service animals are not permitted in water attractions, wet decks, wading pools or rivers.

A Service Animal Relief Area is located in Cedar Point near Gemini. Please look for the designated sign. Owners are responsible for disposing of their animal's waste.



Special Dietary Needs

Although outside food and beverages are not allowed in the park, individuals who have special diets or need items due to a medical condition may bring small coolers to accommodate such needs. Please visit Guest Services for more information.



Wheelchair, & ECV

A limited supply of wheelchairs, electric convenience vehicles (ECV), and strollers are available for rent at Cedar Point Shores. Online reservations are available for wheelchair/ECV rentals in advance of your visit. Reservations can be made by going to sixflags.com/cedarpoint/rentals and visit the rentals page under the Tickets tab. Rentals are also available at the park while supplies last.

All Wheelchairs, ECVs, and strollers may not be taken out of the park gates or to the parking lot. However, a park Associate will be happy to provide any assistance you may need at that time. For any Guest using a personal Segway, please stop by Guest Services prior to entering the park. A wristband must be acquired at the Rental Center to be able to take the wheelchair and/or stroller out of the entrance gates to one of our resorts.

GUESTS USING WHEELCHAIRS

Guests who choose to use a wheelchair or ECV must maintain a safe speed while traveling in the park. Wheelchairs and ECVs cannot be accommodated on most attractions, with the exception of: Breakwater Bay; Lakeslide Landing; Mufflehead's Beach Bar; and SplashH2O (ground level only), where Manual wheelchairs can be accommodated. Please refer to the individual attraction description in the back of this brochure for more specific information. On most attractions where Guests in wheelchairs can be accommodated, Guests will need to leave their wheelchairs to be seated. In most cases, a wheelchair may be left in a designated position on the walkway near the attraction. If in doubt about your ability to safely experience an attraction, we urge you to consult with our staff at the Information Station. Cedar Point Shores personnel are not trained in transferring Guests from wheelchairs to ride units and are not permitted to

do so. You should plan your visit with someone who can physically help you when necessary. Guests may re-charge their wheelchair battery at the Information Station.

A water wheelchair is available for Guests requiring additional assistance when gaining access into: Breakwater Bay; Lakeslide Landing; Lemmy's Lagoon; Mufflehead's Beach Bar; and SplashH₂O (ground level only).

The water wheelchair may be used by multiple Guests on the same day. While in the wave pool, the water level may not exceed the height of the seat on the chair. Guests participating in a wave pool are permitted to use a personal wheelchair. Personal wheelchairs are permitted up to the seat's water depth. Guests utilizing wheelchairs will not be required to utilize a life jacket while in the wave pool only if their height exceeds 52" and meets all other Rider criteria for the attraction. Guests may choose to use a water wheelchair instead of a personal wheelchair. While using either a personal wheelchair or a water wheelchair, Guests must not utilize the wheelchair's seat belts while in the wave pool.

Motorized or electric personal wheelchairs will be permitted at Lemmy's Lagoon. Walkers, canes, or other assistive devices are permitted only at ankle depth in the following attractions: Breakwater Bay; Lakeslide Landing; Mufflehead's Beach Bar; and Waterin' Hole. A pool lift is available at: Cedar Creek; Great Lakes Cove; and Runaway Rapids.

During your visit, please speak to a member of our Aquatics Supervisory Team to obtain access to the water wheelchair or pool lift and for further accessibility information.

EVACUATIONS

Evacuations may be required due to such causes as a mechanical reason, weather conditions, or a power interruption. If an evacuation is required, Guests may be asked to evacuate pools as quickly as possible using stairs or ladders. If an evacuation from a slide is required, remain seated until given instructions. For safety reasons, we may evacuate ambulatory Guests prior to evacuating those Guests using wheelchairs. If so, you accept any risk due to delayed evacuation or if we need to physically lift or lower you.

GUESTS OF A LARGER SIZE

Due to manufacturer requirements, Guests of a larger size (in terms of height, weight, and/or proportions) may not be accommodated on some of our attractions. Maximum and minimum weight limits can be found under the individual attractions in this guide and on the Safety Guide Signs at the entrance to attractions with restrictions

LOOSE ARTICLES

Most attractions cannot accommodate loose articles including jewelry, cell phones, hats, eyewear, cameras, purses, backpacks, beverage containers, electronic devices, etc. Items must be safely secured in a waist pack, in a locker, or with a non-Rider. Cedar Point Shores is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged items.

For safety reasons, cell phone usage, taking pictures, and filming on attractions are prohibited. Glasses must be secured on all attractions. On Point Plummet, glasses must be secured by an athletic strap or they cannot be worn on the attraction.

Hearing devices and other electronic devices may be damaged by water. Please take necessary precautions to protect hearing devices on all attractions.

Sensory headphones or helmets may be accommodated on select attractions. Please see an Associate for more details. Any non-compliance which results in damage or injury to a person or property will result in consequences up to and including prosecution.

LOST AND FOUND

All items found at Cedar Point Shores are turned in to the Information Station. After 24 hours, items are moved to Cedar Point's Lost and Found. If you lose an item on an attraction, we will search for the article as soon as possible. In order to keep the attraction in operation, an immediate search may not be possible. Lost articles may be reported at sixflags.com/lost-and-found.

For your safety, do not enter unauthorized areas to retrieve lost articles. You can be seriously injured if you enter an unauthorized area.

OXYGEN TANKS

Neither portable oxygen tanks nor personal oxygen equipment are permitted on waterpark attractions.

STROBE LIGHTING & SPECIAL EFFECTS

Some attractions utilize special effects, including but not limited to: haze and other atmospheric effects, scents, areas of low lighting, loud music, sound effects, strobe lighting and other specialty lighting. Guests with medical conditions that may be impacted by these special effects are advised not to participate in these attractions. Attractions utilizing these effects include: Crosscurrent.

PROPER ATTIRE

Appropriate swimwear is required to participate in all attractions. Thongs and transparent clothing/swimwear are not permitted. We reserve the right to determine the

appropriateness of swimwear. Guests wearing bathing attire with metal buttons, rivets, zippers, or snaps will not be permitted to ride participate in any of our slides attractions, with the exception of Storm Surge. Jewelry including but not limited to, necklaces, bracelets, dangling earrings, and rings other than wedding bands are prohibited on Point Plummet. For your safety, loose clothing (including scarves and other free-flowing clothing) must be significantly secured or removed and placed in a waist pack, in a locker, or with a non-participant to prevent any interference with the ride experience. Hearing devices or other electronic devices may be damaged by water. Please take the necessary steps to protect such items. Contact lenses are not recommended. Guests requiring special accommodation should speak to a member of the Aquatics Supervisory Team.

SWIM DIAPERS

Guests who require a diaper are required to wear swim diapers or a diaper specifically designed for aquatic use while participating in Cedar Point Shores attractions. Swim diapers are available for purchase at Sandals.

RIDER CRITERIA

Our Attraction Accessibility Program is designed to allow Guests to participate in the enjoyment of our attractions as much as possible. The program was developed by analyzing the physical and mental attributes required to safely participate on/in each attraction. It is our policy to allow anyone to participate who meets all these requirements and is not a hazard to themselves or others. We continue to evaluate and update our Attraction Accessibility Program as necessary.

The evaluation of each attraction considered the following criteria:

Independent seated postural.

The Guest must have the body and spinal control to sit upright without the aid of other people or devices. The Guest must also have sufficient muscle control to support their head, neck and upper torso during the course of the ride, including the dynamic motion of the ride. Certain ride units such as carousel horses require the ability to form a saddle posture with the Guest's thighs.

Appropriate center of gravity.

The Guest's body must have the appropriate weight distribution for that ride.

Ability to hold on with one functioning arm.

Guests must have one functioning arm that exhibits good grip control, the ability to brace, and is strong enough to allow the Guest to maintain proper riding position throughout the duration of the ride. A functioning arm

may be a natural arm or a prosthesis which can be used for gripping and bracing. Any arm prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prostheses.

Ability to hold on with two functioning arms.

Guests must have two functioning arms that exhibit good grip control, the ability to brace, and are strong enough to allow the Guest to maintain the proper riding position throughout the duration of the ride. A functioning arm may be a natural arm or a prosthesis which can be used for gripping and bracing. Any arm prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prostheses.

Ability to brace self with one functioning leg.

Guests must have one functioning leg to be used for bracing the body during the course of the ride. A functioning leg may be a natural leg or a prosthesis used for bracing the body during the course of participation and maintaining balance when entering and exiting an attraction unit. Any leg prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prostheses.

Ability to brace self with two functioning legs.

Guests must have two functioning legs to be used for bracing the body during the course of the ride. A functioning leg may be a natural leg or a prosthesis used for bracing the body during the course of participation and maintaining balance when entering and exiting an attraction unit. Any leg prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prostheses.

Minimum of two functioning extremities.

Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities (two legs, two arms, or one arm and one leg) to brace themselves during the ride and assist in entering and exiting the ride unit.

Minimum of three functioning extremities.

Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities (two legs and one arm or two arms and one leg) to brace themselves (with tripod bracing) during the ride and assist in entering and exiting the ride unit.

Minimum of four functioning extremities.

Guests must have four functioning extremities (two legs and two arms) to brace themselves during the ride and assist in entering and exiting the ride unit.

Ability to enter/exit ride within specified parameters without endangering self or others.

Guests must be able to enter and exit the ride without jeopardizing themselves or others and to assist with their own evacuation, if necessary. This may include special arrangements such as entering through the Alternate Access Entrance or having someone aid in boarding. For the safety of our Associates and Guests, Associates or Team Member are instructed not to perform any lifting of Guests.

Appropriate observed behavior.

Guest demonstrates appropriate observed behavior indicating a willingness and ability to participate and/or follow Guest requirements. Appropriate observed behavior may include, but not be limited to maintaining proper riding position, attention and compliance to safety instructions, proper use of all ride safety equipment and willingness to participate.

Guests have a duty to:

- Exercise good judgment
- Act in a responsible manner while using amusement rides
- Not participate while under the influence of alcohol or drugs
- Properly use all ride safety equipment provided

ATTRACTIONS

The following descriptions are designed to give you information on the types of actions caused by various attractions. Each of the following attractions will identify the restrictions according to the criteria outlined on page 14. **In order to participate on most attractions, Guests must have seated postural control, appropriate center of gravity, appropriated observed behavior, and the ability to enter and exit the attraction safely.** Specific exceptions or qualifications to those four criteria will be noted in the information provided below. Please use caution when entering and exiting waterpark attractions as the surrounding areas may be slippery. Conveying devices such as tubes and rafts may be slippery and can shift during loading and unloading.

Breakwater Bay Wave Pool 4



Life jackets are required for Guests who are less than 52" tall in bare feet, participants with a history of seizures (or similar medical conditions), heart conditions, or those who are inexperienced or non-swimmers. Children who are less than 42" tall must wear life jackets and be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. A Supervising Companion may accompany up to two Guests.

A large wave pool with depths ranging from 0' – 6'. Waves are generated for five minutes on, and then five minutes off. Strenuous activity is required during wave action cycles which may require the ability to swim and which may result in fatigue. Exercise caution. Participants with a history of seizures — or heart or other serious medical conditions — should be supervised by someone who knows how to swim and how to provide emergency assistance.

Rider Criteria: Guests must be able to maintain independent seated postural control and must have appropriate observed behavior or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants participation or water depth may be restricted if necessary and must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests with a full arm cast or full leg cast are welcome to enjoy the attraction, but participation or water depth may be restricted if necessary. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone or braced arm cast cannot participate.

Rider Access: To participate in a Wave Pool, a Guest who is non-ambulatory must wear a life jacket and be accompanied by a Supervising Companion if they do not have an assistive device - wheelchair, walker or cane(s). A Guest in a wheelchair will not be required to wear a life jacket if their height exceeds 42". Guests in either water wheelchairs or personal wheelchairs will be asked to not utilize the wheelchair's seatbelts while in the Wave Pool. Personal wheelchairs are permitted in wave pools up to the water depth of the seat. Walkers and canes may be permitted in wave pools up to ankle depth.

Cedar Creek **2**



Children must be 42" tall in bare feet to ride alone or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Children under 48" tall in bare feet or those who are inexperienced or non-swimmers are required to wear a life jacket. A Supervising Companion may accompany up to two children.

A 1,200-foot, slow-moving river with tubes. Guests may float with or without a tube.

Rider Criteria: Guests must be able to maintain independent seated postural control and must have appropriate observed behavior or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests must have a minimum two functioning extremities; one arm and one leg, or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Access is available via the stairs or pool lift. Guests will have to transfer to the stairs, lift, or tube, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please speak to a member of our Aquatics Supervisory Team to obtain access to the pool lift.

Crosscurrent & Plunge Slide



Guests must be 48" tall in bare feet to ride.

Maximum Weight – 300 lbs. per tube

Two redesigned single-Rider, partially enclosed serpentine tube slides ending in a 42" deep pool. One single Rider straightaway humpbacked tube slide ending in a 42" deep pool.

Rider Criteria: Riders are required to maintain the proper riding position – sitting face forward in a tube, holding onto tube handles with legs extended forward. Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities; two functioning arms and one functioning leg. Full arm casts, braced arm casts, foot or lower leg casts, full leg casts, cervical collars or neck braces, or broken collarbones are not permitted.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs with a tube. Guests will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the tube, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the tube may shift. The tube and surrounding area may also be slippery.

Great Lakes Cove



Guests under 54" tall in bare feet or those who are inexperienced or non-swimmers are required to wear a life jacket. Children must be 42" tall in bare feet to ride alone or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

An interactive pool with floatables. Maximum water depth is 48" deep.

Rider Criteria: Guests must be able to maintain independent seated postural control, must have appropriate observed behavior, and the ability to enter and exit the attraction safely or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Access is available via the stairs or pool lift. Guests will have to transfer to the stairs, lift, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please speak to a member of our Aquatics Supervisory Team to obtain access to the pool lift.

Lake Erie Nor'easter 5



Guest must be 48" tall in bare feet to ride.

Maximum Weight – 250 lbs. per tube

Enclosed serpentine tube slides ending in a 42" pool.

Rider Criteria: Guests must sit facing forward in a tube, holding onto the tube handles with legs extended forward. Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities; two functioning arms and one functioning leg. Full arm casts, braced arm casts, foot or lower leg casts, full leg casts, cervical collars or neck braces, or broken collarbones are not permitted.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs with a tube. Guests will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the tube, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the tube may shift. The tube and surrounding area may also be slippery.

Lakeslide Landing – Pool 1



A zero-depth entry childrens pool. Maximum water depth is 24" deep.

Rider Criteria: Guests without seated postural control or appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Rider Access: Access is available via the zero depth entry. This attraction is wheelchair accessible. A water wheelchair is available for Guests requiring additional assistance. Please speak to a member of our Aquatics Supervisory Team to obtain access to the water wheelchair.

Lakeslide Landing – Slides 2



Guests must be 36" tall in bare feet to ride the slides.

Maximum Weight – 200 lbs. per Rider

An interactive water playground with slides and mini water thrills. Maximum water depth is 24" deep.

Rider Criteria: Riders are required to maintain the proper riding position – feet first lying on your back or in a sitting position (sit up to go slower, lie down to go faster). Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; sufficient upper extremities to maintain the proper riding position and one functioning leg. Forearm casts, full arm casts, braced arm casts, foot or lower leg casts, full leg casts, cervical collars or neck braces, or broken collarbones are not permitted.

Rider Access: Access is available via the zero depth entry. This attraction is wheelchair accessible, although the water level may not exceed the height of the seat on the chair. A water wheelchair is available for participants requiring additional assistance. Please speak to a member of our Aquatics Supervisory Team to obtain access to the water wheelchair.

Lemmy's Lagoon 1



A zero-depth interactive water playground featuring slides and water features.

Rider Criteria:

Slides: Riders must have a minimum of three functioning extremities; one functioning arm and two functioning legs. Full arm casts, forearm casts, braced arm casts, full leg casts, lower leg casts, cervical collars or neck braces, or broken collarbones are not permitted to ride.

Splash Pad: Guests unable to maintain seated postural control, have the ability to safely enter and exit the attraction or demonstrate appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Rider Access: Access is available via the zero depth entry. This attraction is wheelchair accessible. A water wheelchair is available for Guests requiring additional assistance. Please speak to a member of our Aquatics Supervisory Team to obtain access to the water wheelchair. Motorized/ electric personal wheelchairs are permitted on splash pads.

Lily Pad Walk 3



Guests under 54" tall in bare feet or those who are inexperienced or non-swimmers are required to wear a life jacket. Children must be 42" tall in bare feet to ride alone or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

An interactive Lily Pad Crossing. Maximum water depth is 48" deep.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have appropriated observed behavior, and the ability to enter and exit the attraction safely or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants may not participate. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Access is available via the stairs or pool lift. Guests will have to transfer to the stairs, lift, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please speak to a member of our Aquatics Supervisory Team to obtain access to the pool lift.

Muffleheads Beach Bar 1



A 21+ adult pool and bar. ID required for entry. Water depth is 0" – 42".

Rider Criteria: Guests must be able to maintain independent seated postural control, must have appropriate observed behavior, and the ability to enter and exit the attraction safely or be accompanied by a companion 21 years or older.

Rider Access: Access is available via the zero depth entry. This attraction is wheelchair accessible, although the water level may not exceed the height of the seat on the chair. A water wheelchair is available for Guests requiring additional assistance. Please speak to a member of our Aquatics Supervisory Team to obtain access to the water wheelchair.

Perch Plunge 4



Guests must be 48" tall in bare feet to ride.

Maximum Weight – 300 lbs. per Rider

Three single-Rider, partially enclosed, serpentine body slides ending in a 42" splash pool.

Rider Criteria: Riders are required to remain lying flat against the slide, hands interlocked behind your head, and legs crossed at the ankles. Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities; one functioning arm, and two functioning legs. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Guests will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the slide, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Point Plummet 5



Guests must be 48" tall in bare feet to ride.

Maximum Weight – 300 lbs. per Rider

Riders stand in an enclosed capsule where the floor drops, launching them down high-speed drops and banked turns before ending in a water-filled runout. Rider will experience high speeds, weightlessness, and rapid movements from side to side. Maximum water depth is 6".

Rider Criteria: Riders must stand with their head and back against the slide, legs firmly crossed at the ankles, with arms folded across the chest, and maintain position throughout ride. Guests must have two functioning arms and two functioning legs. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, forearm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Lower body casts (foot, lower leg, etc.) are not permitted on this ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Guests will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the slide, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the area may be slippery.

NOTE: Loose articles are not permitted, including, but not limited to: piercings, necklaces, rings, T-shirts.

Portside Plunge Slide 5



Guests must be 48" tall in bare feet to ride.

Maximum Weight – 300 lbs. per tube

Two slides send Riders, who are seated on an inner tube, through twists and turns in near complete darkness.

Rider Criteria: Riders must be seated in the tube, facing forward, and holding onto the handles. Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities; two functioning arms and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Lower body casts (foot, lower leg, etc.) are not permitted on this ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs with a tube. Guests will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the tube, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the tube may shift. The tube and surrounding area may also be slippery.

Riptide Raceway 4



Guests must be 42" tall in bare feet to ride.

Maximum Weight – 300 lbs. per Rider

A 44-foot-tall complex of six separate slides which start in tunnels and end on a run-out.

Rider Criteria: Riders are required to maintain the proper riding position – stomach flat on a mat, head first, and holding on to handles at all times. Keep elbows and knees tucked inward towards the body with your feet held upwards. Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities; two functioning arms and one functioning leg. Full arm casts, braced arm casts, foot or lower leg casts, full leg casts, cervical collars or neck braces, or broken collarbones are not permitted.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs with a mat. Guests will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the mat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the mat may shift. The mat and surrounding area may also be slippery.

Runaway Rapids 3



Children less than 48" tall in bare feet are required to wear a life jacket. Children less than 42" tall in bare feet must wear a life jacket and be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. A Supervising Companion may accompany up to two children.

1,200-foot activity flume which is 30" deep with many tipping buckets, waterfalls, geysers, and a wave channel. Guests may float, with or without a tube.

Rider Criteria: Guests must be able to maintain independent seated postural control and must have appropriate observed behavior or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests must have a minimum of one functioning arm and one functioning leg, or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Access is available via the stairs or pool lift. Guests will have to transfer to the stairs, lift, or tube, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please speak to a member of our Aquatics Supervisory Team to obtain access to the pool lift.

SplashH2O – Slides 1 2 3 varies by slide



Some slides have varied height requirements. Slide height requirements are either 36" tall or 40" tall depending on the height of the slide.

Maximum Weight – 300 lbs. per Rider

Seven body slides within the SplashH2O Structure. Pool depth is between 0" – 6" deep.

Rider Criteria: Riders are required to maintain the proper riding position – arms locked behind head, legs crossed at the ankles, and back flat against the slide. Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities; one functioning arm and two functioning legs. Guests must have sufficient upper extremities to maintain the proper riding position. Forearm casts, full arm casts, braced arm casts, foot or lower leg casts, full leg casts, cervical collars or neck braces, or broken collarbones are not permitted on slides.

Add Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Riders will have to ascent the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the slide, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

SplashH2O – Play Structure 1



Interactive water play structure with a large tipping bucket and multiple levels connected by net crawls, bridges, and stairways.

Ride Criteria: Guests unable to maintain seated postural control must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Rider Access: Access is available on the ground level. Access to the elevated levels require Guests to walk up several flights of stairs.

Storm Surge 5



Guests must be 46" tall in bare feet to ride.

Maximum Weight – 300 lbs. per Rider; 1,000 lbs. per raft.
Minimum of two Riders; maximum of four.

Family tube slide with high-banked turns, sudden drops, and a winding twisting pathway ending in a 24" deep pool.

Rider Criteria: Riders are required to remain seated with back against the raft, facing forward, and holding onto the handles. Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities; two functioning arms and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Guests will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the raft, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the raft may shift. The raft and surrounding area may also be slippery.

Waterin' Hole 1



Interactive water playground for children with play elements. Maximum water depth is 15" deep.

Rider Criteria: Guests unable to maintain seated postural control must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests with cervical collars or neck braces, or broken collarbones are not permitted on elevated play structures.

Rider Access: This attraction is wheelchair accessible, although the water level may not exceed the height of the seat on the chair and remain on ground level. A water wheelchair is available for Guests requiring additional assistance. Please speak to a member of our Aquatics Supervisory Team to obtain access to the water wheelchair.

Waterin' Hole – Slides 1



An interactive water playground for children with slides and play elements. Maximum water depth is 15" deep.

Rider Criteria: Riders are required to maintain the proper riding position – arms locked behind head, legs crossed at the ankles, and back flat against the slide. Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; sufficient upper extremities to maintain the proper riding position and one functioning leg. Forearm casts, full arm casts, braced arm casts, foot or lower leg casts, full leg casts, cervical collars or neck braces, or broken collarbones are not permitted on slides.

Rider Access: Access is available via the zero depth entry. Access to the attraction requires climbing a few steps. Riders will have to be capable of safely entering the slide, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Wild Walleye 5



Guests must be 48" tall in bare feet to ride.

Maximum Weight – 300 lbs. per tube

Two single-Rider, serpentine tube slides ending in a 42" deep pool.

Rider Criteria: Riders are required to maintain the proper riding position – sitting face forward in a tube, holding onto tube handles with legs extended forward. Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities; two functioning arms and one functioning leg. Full arm casts, braced arm casts, foot or lower leg casts, full leg casts, cervical collars or neck braces, or broken collarbones are not permitted.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs with a tube. Guests will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the tube, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the tube may shift. The tube and surrounding area may also be slippery.
